
This mission, proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying, is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each of us.

Parishioners who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;


All Catholics who give generous support-time, money, prayers and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church.

OUR JOURNEY TO BUILD OUR CHURCH


From the very beginning, our parishioners have worked together to build up the physical presence that is St. Patrick Catholic Church. Through capital campaigns, fundraisers and gifts via estates/wills we have purchased the ten acres we sit on, built the Ministry Center and constructed the road and parking lots necessary to support the future church building.

In the chart below, you will see the Building Fund income and expenses by calendar year. It should be noted that all donations received for any capital campaign or designated for the Building Fund, are deposited into our Restricted Funds on Deposit savings account. All expenses paid from that account are reviewed by the Office of Construction & Real Estate, our parish Business Manager and our Pastor.

This chart reflects data through June 2023 which was the end of our fiscal year.

During the 4th quarter of 2018 we kicked-off our capital campaign - FROM HERE TO ETERNITY.

Since our founding in 1989, St. Patrick Catholic Church has grown and evolved into a vibrant multi-cultural community of more than 3,000 families. For many years, we have conducted Capital Campaigns that have allowed us to purchase the Pigeon Pass property, build a multipurpose building we call the Ministry Center (Phase I) and remodel our kitchen, expand storage space and complete the onsite improvements necessary to support parking lots that hold 350 vehicles (Phase II).

During this time, our Ministry Center has gone through daily transformations to accommodate an annual 750-student Faith Formation program, Baptisms, 1st Communions, Quinceañeras, Confirmations, Weddings and Funerals – returning to the set up for the weekend's Mass schedule each week. Needless to say, this activity has taken its toll on the Ministry Center.

For this reason, and due to the desire of many to have a more beautiful and fitting space in which to celebrate the Sacraments, we have committed to Phase III of our construction that will provide a 24,000 sq. ft. church that is more conducive to worship. The From Here to Eternity capital campaign is meant to raised the funds necessary for this construction.



A MESSAGE FROM FINANCE COUNCIL & BUSINESS MANAGER

We are pleased to provide you with the Annual Report to the Parish for fiscal year 2022/2023 and we hope that you have taken the opportunity to review the highlights of what our parish community has accomplished through your contributions of Time, Talent and Treasure.

Financial transparency is a priority and we welcome your comments and questions. The resources that you provide are greatly needed and appreciated by our entire spiritual community. We are grateful to have parishioners who so unselfishly and generously give of their Time, Talen and Treasure.

Reflecting on the vibrant sense of community that filled our parish this past year, we want to acknowledge the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners and the numerous guests that continue to visit and contribute to our sacred church. As a result, we find ourselves in a healthier financial position than at the end of last year. Our parish operating revenue of \$1,036,569 exceeded our operating expenses of \$917,541. This surplus enabled us to invest over \$27,900 in site improvements while also increasing our management reserve in Funds on Deposit. A well-funded management reserve will give us the flexibility to cover future needs of our parish campus and facilities.

The growth in the number of registered households is one way to indicate that the Spirit of God is alive and well and working through our parish community. Our St. Patrick family has grown 6.2% in the last year, which has contributed to our operating revenue increase of 16.6% year over year. We also enjoyed an overwhelming support for Fr Cortez's goal of improving our parish campus through our Maintenance Fund donations.

Moving into the new fiscal year (2023/2024) we are facing the rising cost of property/earthquake insurance and increases in the cost of utilities. We will continue to monitor all expenditures to insure that we are being good stewards of the assets we are entrusted with.
